

# Halal Product Recall Plan (HPRP)

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## 1. Purpose

The purpose of this Recourse Plan is to outline the necessary steps we will take in the event of suspected or confirmed contamination of any halal products with non-halal substances. This plan ensures that we, as the responsible business operator, protect the integrity of our halal products and safeguard our consumers by removing contaminated products promptly from the market.

## 2. Roles and Responsibilities

We are responsible for carrying out all tasks related to the recall process, including:

- **Decision-Making:** We are responsible for determining when to recall a product based on contamination risks.
- **Investigation:** We will investigate the cause of the contamination to assess the scope and severity.
- **Communication:** We are tasked with notifying consumers, distributors, retailers, and relevant parties about the recall.
- **Retrieval and Disposal:** We will manage the retrieval, safe disposal, and documentation of affected products.

## 3. Identification of Contaminated Products

To identify products that may be contaminated:

## 4. Immediate Actions Upon Suspected or Confirmed Contamination

When contamination is suspected or confirmed, we will:

## 5. Recall Decision

  - **Public Recall Notice:** If necessary, we will post a public recall notice on our website, social media platforms, and any other channels through which the product was sold. The recall notice will include details about the affected products, how consumers can identify them, and instructions for returns.
- **Retailers and Distributors:** If the products are sold through retailers or distributors, we will immediately notify them about the contamination and instruct them to remove the affected products from their shelves or storage. We will also provide clear instructions on how to return or dispose of the products.

## 7. Retrieval and Disposal of Contaminated Products

- **Step 1 – Retrieval:** We will manage the retrieval of all affected products from consumers, distributors, or retailers. We will offer shipping labels for returned products if necessary and work with distribution partners to pull affected stock from the market.
- **Step 2 – Disposal:** Once we have collected the affected products, we will safely dispose of them to ensure they do not re-enter the market. Products will be destroyed or disposed of in accordance with local regulations.

## 8. Documentation and Record-Keeping

We will maintain comprehensive records throughout the recall process, including:
